

Lorenzo Laws was born in Tampa, Florida at Mac Dill Air Force Base to the late James and Rutha Mae Laws. Growing up in Daytona Beach, he attended and graduated from Mainland High School in 1972 and Bethune-Cookman University in December of 1976, with a B.A. degree majoring in Sociology. Lorenzo continued his education earning another B.A. in Biblical Studies from Logos Christian College, Jacksonville FL. and a Master of Divinity Degree from Asbury Theological Seminary, Orlando FL. Campus, and he received a Doctor of



Ministry Degree (D. Min.) from Asbury Theological Seminary, Wilmore KY. Campus on May 18th, 2024.

Lorenzo has been the President /CEO of Laws & Associates Inc., a successful Insurance & Financial Planning firm for over 30 years and has over 45 years of experience in the Financial Services Industry. He is a graduate of the National Association of Financial Advisors, Washington DC, receiving a professional designation (LUTCF), after completing three years of intense study of the financial services industry in 1980.


Currently he is serving as the Presiding Elder of the Dynamic Daytona Beach District in which on March 19th, 2022, Bishop Frank Madison Reid III appointed him. He had served as the Senior Pastor of Greater Allen Chapel A.M.E. Church, in Melbourne, Florida. Dr. Laws has also served as Senior Pastor of Mt. Zion A.M.E., Hastings FL, and Allen Chapel A.M.E. New Smyrna Beach, FL where he was known to take each congregation to higher heights and left them better than he found them. He is known to have a Servant's Heart, and is reflected by being congregation minded, civic minded and community minded.

May 28th, 2016, through the vision of Rev. Laws, when serving as the pastor of Greater Allen Chapel he initiated their 1st Annual Crane Creek Founders Heritage Festival, which is now called Melbourne Founders Festival. Pastor Laws discovered that Wright Brothers, Peter Wright and Balaam Allen were founders of Crane Creek, which later became Melbourne, Florida. Two of those individuals, Wright Brothers, and Balaam Allen along with Robert and Carrie Lipscomb were also the founders of Greater Allen Chapel A.M.E. Church, the first house of worship in the city of Melbourne. Given the history, Greater Allen Chapel began hosting this annual event to increase awareness of the African American culture, history and role it played in the development of the city of Melbourne.

Rev. Laws have been involved in many boards and organizations throughout the years. More specifically as founder of the Fort Mose Historical Society; FORT MOSE, was the FIRST FREE BLACK COMMUNITY in what is now the United States of America. Established by Spanish King in 1738 as "Gracia Real de Santa Teresa de Mose' it was a haven for Africans escaping slavery to Spanish St. Augustine in which they gained their freedom. Because of Dr. Laws' effort, the Florida Park Service and the Fort Mose Historical Society he was instrumental in securing funding to preserve Fort Mose from developers. They have improved access and expanded facilities for the public, and now have a museum on site for tourist and visitors, so they may experience the fort while protecting the archaeological remains and the environment of this FIRST FREE BLACK COMMUNITY in the USA.

The Reverend Dr. Laws has been married to Gertie Lutrecia Laws since 1978. She is also a 1975 graduate of Bethune Cookman University, and a retired educator serving thirty- five years in the public-school system. They have one daughter, Brittney, a graduate of Florida A&M University, and is the Operations Specialist over Governance for the Episcopal Church National Office in New York, NY. Dr. Laws is a member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, the NAACP, Life Member of the Fort Mose Historical Society, and has served among many other boards and organizations throughout the State of Florida, but the most important service is that of his LORD and Savior Jesus Christ!!!

Dr. Donnell J. Moore



Dr. Donnell J. Moore serves as the Christian Education
Director for the Daytona District of the 11th Episcopal District
of the AME Church, he also serves as Chief Academic Officer
and professor of Biblical Contextual Leadership for The Pillar
Seminar for Contextual Leadership, Omaha, Nebraska. In
2019, he was appointed as the Doctor of Ministry
Coordinator for Payne Theological Seminary, Wilberforce,
Ohio. For 23 years, Dr. Moore served as a senior professor of
Congregational Development and Redevelopment for United
Theological Seminary, Dayton Ohio.

In addition to professorship, Dr. Moore has 30 years of full-time and 15 years of bi-vocational pastoral experience. Dr. Moore received his Bachelor of Business Administration in Marketing and Accounting from Bethune Cookman University, Daytona Beach, Florida in 1979, a Master of Divinity from Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary, Evanston, Illinois in 1996, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from United Theological Seminary, Dayton, Ohio in 2001.

He is the co-editor and author of an essay in a book entitled, *Prophets to the Nations: Black Methodism, Liberation, and the American Quest for Racial Justice,* essays in honor of Drs. James H. Cone and Jacquelyn Grant and is the author of several academic articles and blogs.

Dr. Moore sees himself as a conduit for training and mentoring pastors, ministers, and church leaders to become congregational problem-solvers by utilizing their spiritual journey as the basis for engaging in local church ministry. His ministry mission is to pour himself unselfishly into all levels of church leadership so leaders of the church can become effective Kingdom Builders for the Lord.

Dr. Moore is married to Dr. Angela D. Washington, retired United Methodist Pastor, and Associate Professor of Biblical Contextual Leadership for The Pillar Seminary, Omaha, Nebraska. They have 4 children, 4 grandchildren and 1 great granddaughter.

He began his professional career in the United States House of Representatives, where he served as a Legislative Assistant during the 113th and 114th Congress. Since then, he has held various positions throughout the state of Florida.


In 2018, while working in the Florida Legislature, Genesis assisted in the successful passage of legislation to select Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune as one of two people to represent the state of Florida in the National Statuary Hall Collection in the United States Capitol- a distinct honor which made her the first African American to represent any state in the country.

In 2021, Genesis joined Equal Ground where he managed and expanded their operation in Volusia County. His experience and talents were quickly noticed and he excelled in the position. Less than one year later, the organization created the position of Political Director and tapped Genesis to lead the division. In this role, he was responsible for developing and maintaining relationships with elected officials, tracking legislation, and creating ways to educate Black Floridians about the legislative process.

In addition to holding various positions in government and with Equal Ground, Genesis has managed and consulted on several local and state campaigns.

He is married to a Volusia County educator and they reside in Daytona Beach with their two children.

Apostle/Bishop Courtney D. Williams, Sr.



Apostle/Bishop Courtney D. Williams, Sr. is the Founder of Church for All People, Inc. His heart is for the Inclusion of all people which led him to start this great work. Providing a safe place for ALL people to worship, to serve, and to be sent out to fulfill their destiny. He also serves as 2nd Presiding Bishop of Mighty Is My Yahweh In This House Global Fellowship under Apostle/Bishop David B. Lay. 



